The patient was seen on June 4, 1993, at which time he still had symptoms from his various injuries but overall seemed to be pretty stable. He was given an okay to try to work. It was at this time that we learned that the chiropractic records relating to his various injuries would be unavailable because of legal reasons, although he indicated his interest in having us follow up on these. A re-evaluation by Dr. Engasser at this point was suggested.

So as of April 23, 1993, we can verify that he was no longer disabled from the acute hemarthrosis of the right knee or from the hematoma of the left thigh. We also thought that he would be able to return to school at this time. As of June 4, we thought that he could try work; and as far as I know, he did return to his usual activities which I assume went well. At least I have heard nothing to the contrary.

I hope this information will serve your needs and that it will be adequate to the administration of the insurance policy of your insured.
